

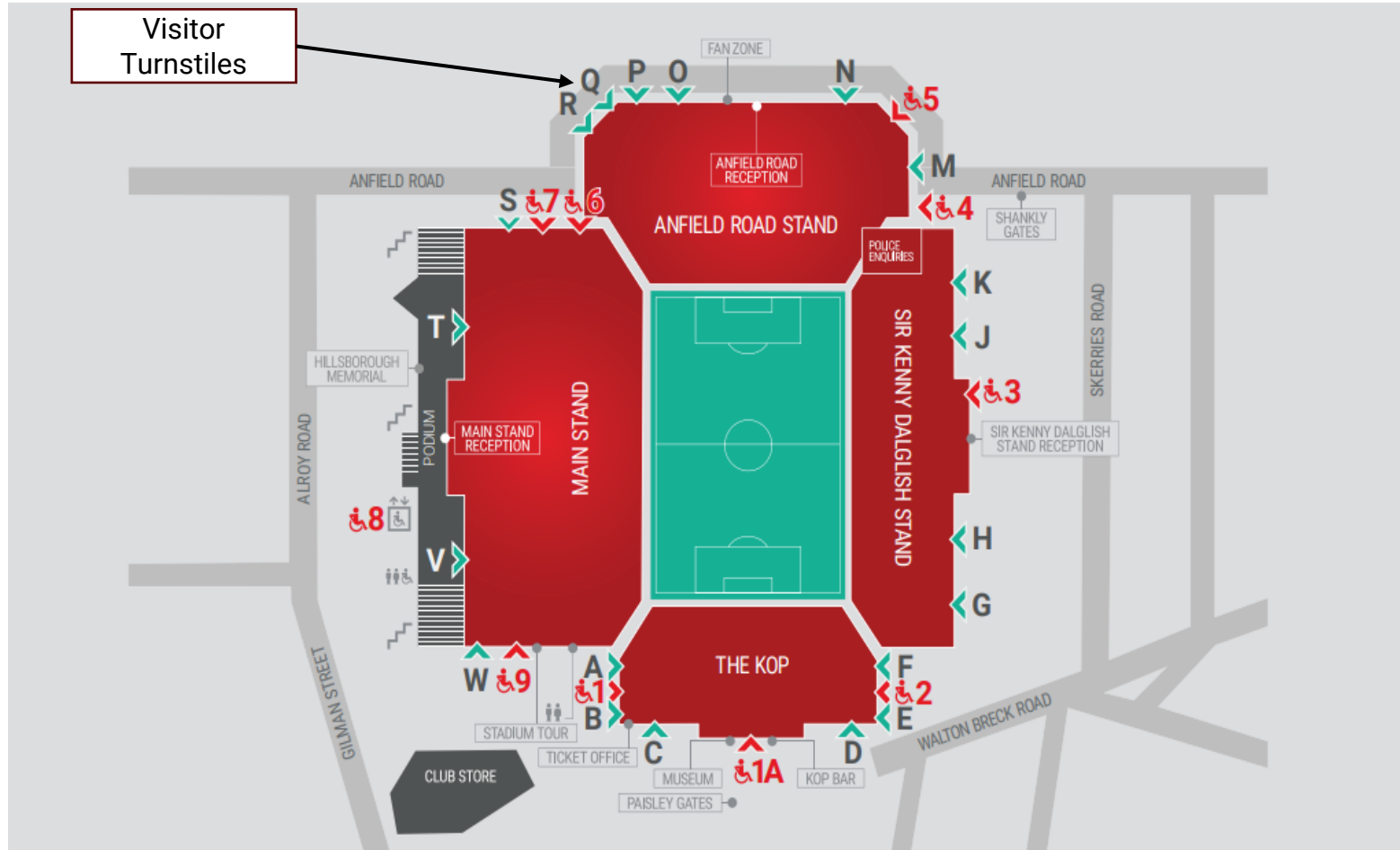

Stadium Map



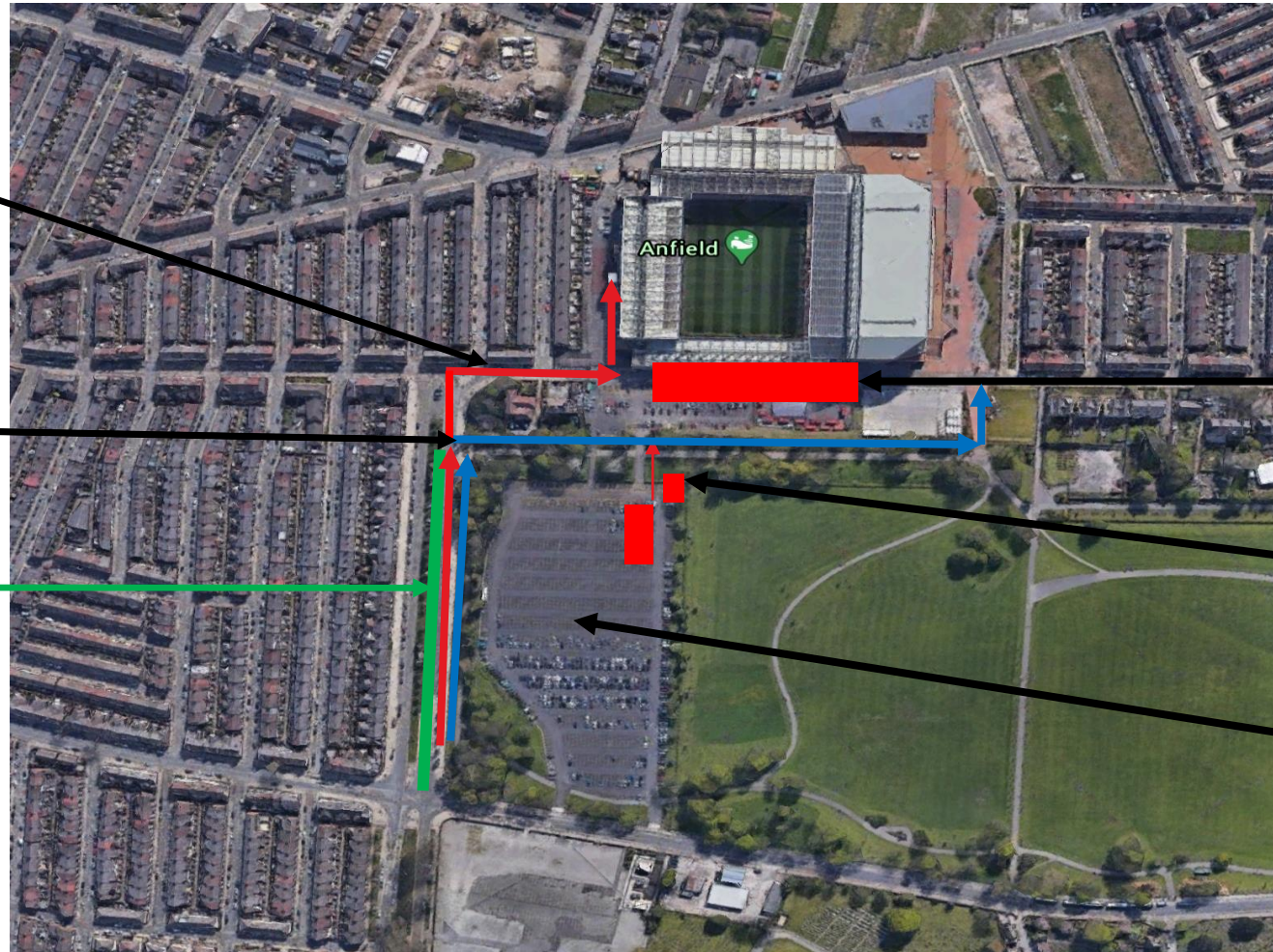

Stadium Access



- Visitors Coach Parking is on Arkles Lane
- Access to the stadium for visiting fans from Arkles Lane is along Dahlia Walk to 97 Avenue.
- Visiting fans will enter via entrances **Q** and **R** and must approach Anfield Rd from the direction of 97 Avenue Turnstiles will open at 2 hours before kick-off for visiting fans.
- Fans are advised to arrive early at the stadium to allow enough time for necessary security checks.
- All fans will be subject to a soft ticket and body search prior to entering the turnstiles
- Pyrotecnic and drugs detection dogs will be present.
- Fans without tickets for this fixture are urged not to travel to the game.

Category 1 Seats



- Category 1 Seats are located in the Sir Kenny Dalglish stand.
- Supporters in these seats must approach the stadium from the direction of Arkles Lane into Anfield Rd as there is **no access** from the direction of 97 Avenue.
- They will enter via turnstile block G or K. Those with access to Champions lounge will enter via SKDS reception.



Transport to the Stadium



- Bus is fast frequent and convenient with 'express' services that will get you to and from Anfield and Liverpool City Centre in around 15mins.
- The 917 is operating from Commutation Row in the City Centre. Prices from £2.20 for single journey, £4.40 for a return journey or £12 return ticket for groups of four are available. U19's can travel for just £1. You can find out more by [clicking here](#).
- If fans use the 917 please note there is a different pick up point after the match to where they were dropped off at. The pick up point is Walton Lane, full details on our website.

Other services are available...

- From Liverpool City Centre, take the 26 from Liverpool ONE bus station, 17 from Queen Square Bus Station or the 917 from St Johns Lane, directly to the ground. The 68/168, which operates between Bootle and Aigburth, and the 14 and 19 (from Queen Square) stop a short walk away from the ground.
- The Soccerbus runs from Sandhills Station, on the Merseyrail Northern Line, to Anfield for all Premier League and cup matches. The Soccerbus runs two hours before each match (last bus from Sandhills Station is approximately 15 minutes before kick-off). You can find out more by [clicking here](#).
- From the city centre to the football stadium is approximately a 50-minute walk. A taxi will cost approximately Euro15.



What can I bring into the Stadium?

Bag Policy

Only the following bags are permitted entry into the stadium:

- **Only small handheld bags which do not exceed A5 size (148.5 x 210 mm / 5.8 x 8.3 inches).**
- **LFC Superstore clear carrier bag containing store purchases only**
- **A bag storage facility is available in Stanley Car Park.**
- Larger bags will only be permitted at the discretion of LFC if they contain medication and / or medical equipment which cannot fit inside an A5 size bag.
- **All bags will be to be subject of a visual search before entry to the stadium.**

Flags and Banners

- Flags under 2m x 1m with a small pole (less than 7mm diameter and less than 1m long) will be allowed in all areas of the stadium.
- Flags over 2m x 1m are permitted in the visitors section providing they have an accompanying fire safety and must be checked prior to entry.
- Flags must not contain anything considered to be offensive, discriminatory, defamatory or inflammatory, including politically motivated or nationalistic.

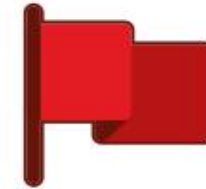

Accessibility



Accessibility



- Public Transport is generally accessible for wheelchair users.
- Car Parking – there is limited availability. Please notify us in advance via the disability email address below.
- Any supporter attending with oxygen is required to notify ourselves prior to arrival via the disability email address below.
- There are 12 wheelchair bays available located in front of the visiting supporters in block 122/123.
- Entrance is via gate DA6 on Anfield Rd as shown on stadium map.
- Headsets for blind supporters are available to order through the disability email address below.
- Seat serve is available at anfield.seatserve.com
- Toilets and First Aid facilities are close to the viewing area.
- LFC Accessibility stewards will be available to assist and identifiable in blue bibs

Stadium Facilities



- The stadium is **cashless**. Contactless and/or chip and pin payments are required in all areas.
- Kiosks will open serving a range of food and drink.
- Alcohol will be served on the concourses.
- Alcohol cannot be consumed in view of the playing area.
- Male and Female toilet facilities are available accessible from the concourse.
- The stadium remains an all seater stadium however we are installing seat with rails as a safety measure. A number of rows at the rear of the visitors section have been installed.
- **Smoking** - Anfield is a totally no smoking football stadium. Any person who smokes inside the stadium will be ejected. This includes electronic cigarettes.

Licenced Safe Standing



- Seats with rails have been installed in the lower Anfield Road stand and Kop
- The seats cannot be locked in either up or down position
- There is a Fan Code of Conduct for these areas.



Licensed Safe Standing



Liverpool FC Code of Conduct

Safe standing areas have been introduced in the Kop and Lower Anfield Rd stands to help keep supporters safe whilst watching the match.

1. You may be required to show your ticket when entering the safe standing area
2. Please do not climb or stand on the rails and seats
3. Please remain in or in front of your allocated seat whilst watching the match, your ticket is for your space only
4. Please do not stand in the Vomitories or on the steps to watch the match

This Code of Conduct supports the existing ground regulations and failure to comply with these may lead to you being removed from the ground and being subject to further sanctions.

Information from the Police

City Centre - Supporters are welcome in all parts of the city however visiting supporters are advised to avoid pubs and bars near to the stadium, specifically Walton Breck Road.

Alcohol - whilst we welcome all supporters to enjoy the hospitality of the city centre, please note it is an offence to enter / attempt to enter the stadium whilst drunk. Anybody who has consumed too much alcohol will be refused entry / ejected from the stadium or arrested. It is also an offence to drink alcohol in the street.

Pyrotechnics - It is an offence to ignite pyrotechnics in a public place or to be in possession of pyrotechnics or attempt to gain entry to and ignite inside the stadium. Any person who breaches this will be arrested.

Homophobic and Racist chanting - Homophobic and Racist chanting is unacceptable and will result in an arrest.

Detection Dogs - Pyrotechnic & drug detection dogs will be present at the turnstiles. Anybody found in possession of such articles may be arrested.

Arrests - Any person arrested may be kept in custody overnight to appear in front of a court the following day.

Hold Back – any decision to support back will be made by the Police Commander sometime during the match. A full announcement will be made in Czech. If supporters are held back they will be permitted to use concourse facilities.

Fan Walk – Police



The Police will facilitate a 'fan walk' from the city centre to the stadium.

The designated meeting point is Williamson Square in the City Centre.

The appointed time to gather is 16:00 on match day and at approximately 17:00 Merseyside Police will facilitate the walk. The walk take approximately 1 hours dependent on the route taken



Emergency Procedures



Evacuation

In the event that the stadium has to be evacuated either fully or partially **Operation Anfield** will be implemented. Announcements in Czech will be made over the public address system and all supporters are requested to follow the instructions and directions given by club stewards, security and the police. A separate plan to evacuate those club officials/players in Zone 1 will also be implemented.

Code Purple

In the unlikely event that a significant terrorist attack takes place outside or in the vicinity of the stadium the emergency plan **Operation Lockdown** will be implemented and no further access to the stadium will be permitted. Announcements in Czech will be made over the public address system requesting all persons outside the stadium to leave the area immediately and to those inside to remain where they are. A separate plan to secure the safety of those club officials/players in Zone 1 will also be implemented.
